About LAWA

Latin American Women's Aid (LAWA) is a community-based organisation led by and for Latin American women and children in London, working to end violence against women and girls (VAWG) since 1987.

We provide a range of different supporting services: we manage the only refuge accommodations for Latin American women and children in the UK and Europe. Likewise, we run a VAWG Advice Centre to provide support and advocacy for women from the Global Majority¹.

In addition to this, we offer crèche, English classes, counselling, a Change Maker empowerment programme, a housing policy project (WAHA) and children and young people's services.

Our mission is to work together with women and children from the Global Majority to end violence and achieve self-determination.

¹ By Global Majority we refer to the population groups that have been widely referred to as "ethnic minorities". We recognise that people of African, Asian, indigenous or mixed origin are not a minority and that, in concrete reality, the experience of whiteness is not the norm for majorities on the planet. The use of this term is a political response to the social, political and economic marginalisation of groups that, from a colonial perspective, have been treated as "minorities".

Volunteer role description

The Change Makers programme is a communitarian programme that brings women together to heal, learn, and grow collectively. It is a space for women of Latin American heritage living in London to reflect on their migratory journeys, build trust, and engage in social justice work. Together, we explore topics such as migration, colonialism, gender-based violence, anti-racism, sisterhood, mental health, among others.

The Change Makers volunteer is an organised and proactive individual with strong planning and facilitation skills. She is flexible, approachable, and deeply committed to supporting participants throughout the programme. Key responsibilities include reaching out to women and informing them of LAWA's workshops, and assisting in the planning and delivery of Change Makers sessions for adult women, Chavitas sessions for young girls, and the Change Makers Book Club.

This volunteer role is subject to an enhanced criminal record (DBS) check paid for by LAWA.

Tasks and Responsibilities

Within the first month:

- To attend a one-day induction, which is mandatory to start volunteering.
- To carry out all assigned trainings at Atlas Citation.
- To attend Lamplight training, carried out by the LAWA Development Officer.

From the second month ahead:

- To assist the link worker in the planning and delivery of group activities, including the monthly face-to-face workshops for the adults' group and the Chavitas group, as well as the monthly sessions of the online book club.
- To implement creative ways to involve Latin American and other women from the Global Majority in the programme.
- To disseminate Change Makers' monthly workshops and activities.
- To maintain up-to-date records of activities developed and of group members' information in our monitoring and evaluation system (Lamplight).
- To assist group members with translation/interpretation if needed.
- To support the management of the programme's databases.
- To attend the mid-term supervision with the Volunteer Coordinator.

Standard practice:

- To work within the confines of confidentiality, ensure that professional boundaries are always maintained when working with service users, staff and external bodies, and work within LAWA's Code of Conduct.
- To ensure that the security of sensitive information is maintained.
- To work within and implement all LAWA's policies and procedures, especially those on Safeguarding, Confidentiality, Individual Support, User Involvement, and Health and Safety.

Person specification

- Be fluent in Latin American Spanish and English (Brazilian Portuguese is desirable).
- Come from a Latin American or Global Majority background.
- Approach others with empathy, respect, and a non-judgmental attitude.
- Have planning and facilitation skills.
- Have good listening skills.
- Have a proactive attitude/ability to take her own initiative.
- Have an active interest in the community and be passionate about community engagement.
- Be committed to social justice work.

Benefits of volunteering at LAWA

- Gain experience and be involved in various aspects of third-sector service provision.
- Learn about gender, intersectionality, and women's issues, through day-to-day work and training opportunities.
- Develop bonds and integrate with fellow Latin American and other Global Majority women in the UK.
- Increase your professional experience and enhance your CV.
- Access to community events and social engagements, both organised by LAWA or enabled through LAWA's facilitation.
- Food and travel allowance (within a limited budget).

LAWA's volunteer programme is open **exclusively** to Latin American and other women from the Global Majority. We encourage applications from Black Latin American as well as LBTQ+ women.
